We used lavender and ginger mint to give the garden a sensory element that we think the children will really enjoy.

This part of the project was to turn a disused area of the playground into an outdoor classroom/wellbeing and reflection area. This area is hidden behind the main building and the mobile classrooms and provides the perfect escape from children wishing to avoid the hustle and bustle of the busy playground which can be overwhelming.

The final stage was to get the bespoke seating constructed and fitted. There are 4 planter spaces to allow us to grow aromatic plants and herbs as well as flowers and climbers.







Year 3 helped to spruce up some of the existing borders on the school playground.




## What do the children think?




I liked looking at the strawberries because they were growing and I like when things grow. I like the fountain because it works! Zac – Year 2




I liked gardening because it makes me happy. In the garden, I like the grass to meditate. Riley – Year 2
